It was resolved to ask the Secretary to ascertain the Number of inhabitants, and that if if there was the requisite Number, we proceed with formation of a Council.

The Chairman & Clerk reported that they had interviewed the Clerk of the County Council, who told us that, if we produced a certified copy of a Resolution, we should receive the Parish Award with other Documents, also the sum of £3.10.3.

Mr Cadman moved. Mr Kester seconded a Resolution that we request the Clerk of the County Council to formally hand over the Parish Award with other Documents, also the £3.10.3 this was carried unanimously.

Re the open Ditch in the High Street we were informed that this was a matter for the Chelston Rural District Council - Hedges & Ditches Committee.

With regard to 6 more Council Houses, we were informed that, before we could Erect 6 Houses, we must first get 6 existing Houses Condemned and demolished, so as to house the people removed from the Condemned Houses. the Government subsidy under the previous Scheme having finished.

An Account for 5/- for putting an Iron Hook on the Village Pump was presented, it was resolved that this be paid.

A request was received from the Post Master of the Village Post Office, that the early closing day be altered from Wednesday to Saturday.

The Council offered no objection to the change.

With reference to the Proposed Bus Shelter on the top Road, we had been informed that we had no power or Authority to Erect a shelter in that place so the Idea had to be dropped. With regard to the 10/- in hand it was resolved that this remain in hand for the present.

The question of the Blind Bend in the Road near Victoria Farm, was discussed, and it was

The Clerk was instructed to write to the Authorities asking when we may expect the Electricity supply in the Parish.

The Clerk was also instructed to write to the Authorities with regard to the Water Supply, with a suggestion as to whether the Pump upon the New Estate could be utilised to feed pipes to the Old Village, and to the New Estate, including the Bungalows along the front towards Cambridge.

The Clerk reported that this Officer had been over and inspected the Pump on the New Estate, and found that this would be unsuitable, but that he was preparing a Scheme to put before the Chesterton Council, to supply Hardwick Coldeote, and Toft. A report was also read from the Local Paper showing that the Matter had been discussed, but no Concrete Proposals seems to have been put forward.

The Clerk was instructed to write to them again claiming urgency and also if necessary to Board of Health, and suggesting that a Water Supply might be had from the East Hunts Water Company. (which is only about 2 Miles

The question of the widening of the dangerous corner near the Victoria Farm, was discussed.

The Clerk was instructed to write to the County Council stating that we are not at all satisfied with it, and consider it still very dangerous, and urging that the widening should be on the inside of the bend.

and also urging the need for a Footpath from the Top road down into the Village on the western side of the road, with the widening of the bend (inside) by 6 or 8 feet.

The question of the living accommodation for the Schoolmistress and her Husband was brought up, when it was decided

This meeting was called especially to consider & discuss the Proposed Water Scheme for the combined Parishes of Hardwick, Caldicote and Toft.

The Clerk read the details of the Scheme which had been received from the Chesterton Rural District Council.

This Scheme if carried out, would according to the Circular from the Chesterton Council, result in a charge on the three Parishes, which would not exceed the equivalent of the proceeds of a 3/- rate in the Pound per annum.

The Scheme is estimated to cost £8,820

(who are preparing a similar Scheme for the Parishes of Eversden Kingston &c) these Parishes being adjacent to the Parishes in this Scheme, so as to supply both areas from one source.
