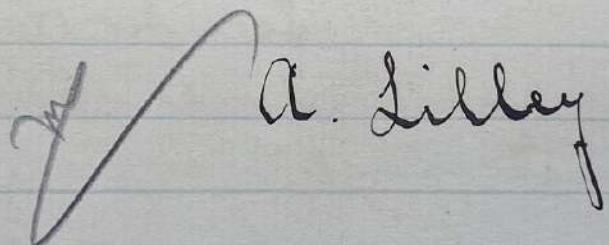
Precept Prop. Mr. Farrant Sec. Mr. Kester that a precept of £6 be issued for General Parish Expenditure for the year ending March 1940.

Fitter Bed  
Gun Pit.

It was decided that the Clerk should make enquiries as to the possibility of permanently filling-in the old village

filter bed, by either the County or Rural District Councils. Also as to who was responsible, for the neglected gun-pit on the corner opposite Mr Fords gateway.

L.D.V. shelter. The Clerk was asked to see Mr Frazer with a view to the L.D.V.s removing loose earth from the Public Footpath to the top of the air-raid shelter for which it was originally intended.

Salvage. The Clerk reported a total collection & disposal, of 2 tons 4 cwt of Paper, & 5 cwt of rags.

Black-out. Proposed Mr. Toyer seconded Mr. Farrant that the Clerk complain to the Chief Constable of the Bad Black out on the New Estate, in spite of complaints to the Local Council Constable. It was suggested that Special Constables drawn from the Estate might assist considerably in the matter.

Mr. Farrant complained on behalf of

The Clerk reported having complained to the Eastern-National Omnibus Co. of people being frequently left at the local bus stops owing to inadequate accommodation in the buses, but had to date received no reply.

barricade across the St. Neots Rd. footpath at the road block & it was agreed that nothing further could be done in the matter

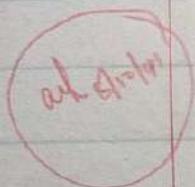
Elections

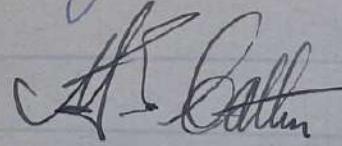

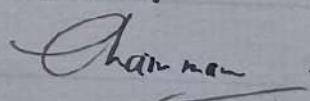

Parish Council meeting held in the school on Friday, May 10th, 1946. Those present were the Chairman, Messrs. Bond, Coxall, Cutter, Hepher, Martin, Purse, and Miss Warrington from the Rural Community Council, and Mr. Fraser, trustee of the Village Hall.

**Minutes:** These were read, and Mr. Hepher proposed and Mr. Cutter seconded that they be adopted. It was decided to leave all items arising out of minutes to the end of the meeting, and to go on to the question of playing field.

**Playing Field:** The following are the main points raised by Miss Warrington:  
A good deal has happened that has helped to get recreation grounds for small villages. Chesterton R.D.C. decided about one year ago, to abolish special rates, and to put such things as lighting and provision of playing fields as one of the services they are prepared to render for parishes, by putting cost on to general rate; has not only the advantage of not costing village so much, but has the advantage of doing away with the parish meeting. In 1937 the Physical Training and Recreation Act was passed. Imbursed between Local Authority and Central Authority (Board of Education); this did not live long because of the war. The main provisions of that Bill have been incorporated in the Education Act 1944. It is a direct grant to people who are going to do the job, and not a thing which is paid through the local authority, and the local authority has to raise a proportion of it. This is tax payers money, not rate payers money. It is worked out on size of village, completeness of scheme, population of village, etc.etc. Pretty certain that we should get 1/3 of capital cost of land purchase, fencing, and amount spent on laying out as a recreation ground. Would be expected to do something for all ages of community, old and young. Advantage of doing it through district council is that they make application and raise the loan; they get grant at whatever scale it is and raise loan on remainder of the money. District Council would appoint Parish Council plus representatives of sports clubs and a district councillor, as management committee for recreation ground. We have power to raise a rate if needed; probably district council would do this.

Mr. Oxenham is planning officer now. No site is ear-marked for Hardwicke (this according to Miss Warrington, though Mr. Fraser here remarked that a plan was prepared in 1937, and still stands, that a field belonging to Red Brick Farm is ear-marked), and that the district council would be prepared to consider a playing field. Mr. Oxenham would be willing to come out and discuss matters with us after we have decided on two or three sites in the village. It is not for the Parish Council in the first instance, to think too seriously of any other point except as to what is going to make a good recreation ground. Need not be an existing grass field.

Size of recreation ground. Normally 5 acres and fairly square. Can get on this size field, cricket and football pitches, tennis court, bowling green and a childrens corner. Should be sufficient room for small scale car park for visiting sports teams, etc.

When site is selected, let them have a 25" map of site; mark N. and any particular features, and what games to be played on it. National Playing Fields Association will then submit plan to us for our approval. Ministry of Education will then accept it. First let Chesterton R.D.C. deal with purchase, deal with raising of loan, remaining purchase, and laying out. Cost to village will come in general rate if Chesterton R.D.C. is helping with up-keep. Main expense is keeping ground in order, the mowing of grass.

Village Hall. Have joint scheme and build village hall on recreation ground; makes more of a social centre. Advantage of grant and loan; Carnegie Trust give 1/3 of cost outright, and Government Department give free of interest loan of  $\frac{1}{2}$  total cost. Available when village has raised 1/6 of cost (this for village under population of 750). Can get a grant for improvement. Under 1944 Act, local authorities can finance village hall schemes.

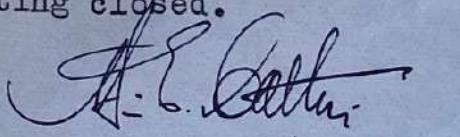
Combined Scheme. 1. Find site and get in touch with Mr. Oxenham.  
 2. Miss Warrington writes to National Council of Social Services asking what steps can be taken.  
 3. Prepare scheme itself. Miss Warrington has forms; send them with an estimate and plans if possible, to National Council of Social Services. Pass all playing fields side of grant to Ministry of Education; make own enquiries and deal with district council about it; National Council will deal with Village Hall side. Grant includes furniture: chairs, tables and piano.

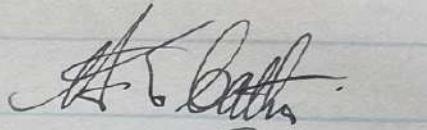

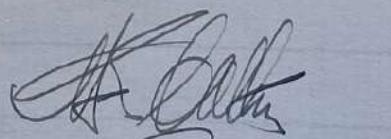
